Dr. Stephen KlinebergFounding Director, Kinder Institute for Urban Research
Professor Emeritus of Sociology, Rice University

A graduate of Haverford College, with an M.A. from the University of Paris and a Ph.D. from Harvard, Stephen Klineberg is a Professor of Sociology at Rice University.

In 1982, he and his students initiated the annual "Houston Area Survey," now in its 38th year of tracking the demographic patterns, economic outlooks, experiences, and beliefs of Harris County residents.

He has published a series of reports on this ongoing research and is at work on a book project exploring the national implications of the Houston findings. "Prophetic City: Houston on the Cusp of a Changing America" will be available

The founding-director of Rice University's Kinder Institute for Urban Research, he is the recipient of twelve major teaching awards and a much sought-after speaker in the Houston community and beyond.

Khambrel Marshall is a member of the KPRC 2 Severe Weather Team and delivers the weekend forecasts. He also is a host of "Houston Newsmakers with Khambrel Marshall," a weekly program that delves into issues in the news that Southeast Texans most care about. Prior to this, he was a weekend sports anchor in Phoenix, sports reporter, sports director, then primary news anchor in Miami. Khambrel took a newsroom leadership role as Executive Producer for several years, before accepting a position as weekend meteorologist. Khambrel won an Emmy, for a feature series titled "Guardians at Sea," chronicling the efforts of the U.S. Coast Guard to rescue Cuban and Haitian refugees crossing the Florida Straits.

Khambrel is a dedicated community volunteer and has been honored as the March of Dimes Texas Communications volunteer of the year. He has also been a past Chairman of the Executive Committee of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Southeast Texas, and past board member of Collaborative for Children and the March of Dimes, Texas Gulf Coast. Currently, Khambrel sits on the Board of Directors and is Chairman of the YMCA of Greater Houston, a board member of Susan G. Komen, Houston and Co-Chair of the 2019 Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure. He is also a Senior Fellow in the "American Leadership Forum: Houston/Gulf Coast Chapter." The intense ALF one-year program is designed to join and strengthen diverse leaders in the community to better serve the public good.
